LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Understand the past and present role of the Royal Canadian Legion
- Participate in a form of active remembrance

ACTIVITIES:

- Watch the Royal Canadian Legion video (<u>http://valourcanada.ca/video-documentaries/the-royal-canadian-legion/</u>).
- Discuss the historical and present role of the Royal Canadian Legion and its association with the concept of remembrance.
- List, decide on, and participate in an individual or collective act of remembrance. Examples include:
 - o Attending a Remembrance Day ceremony
 - o Visiting a monument
 - o Meeting with a veteran
 - $\circ~$ Talking with family members or exploring family history
 - o Writing a first-hand history of a soldier or veteran
 - $\circ~$ Designing a symbol of remembrance (i.e. the poppy)
 - $\circ~$ Creating a work of art on a remembrance related theme
 - o Attending a "No Stone Left Alone" ceremony
 - $\circ\;$ Donating to or raising money for a charity that supports veterans
